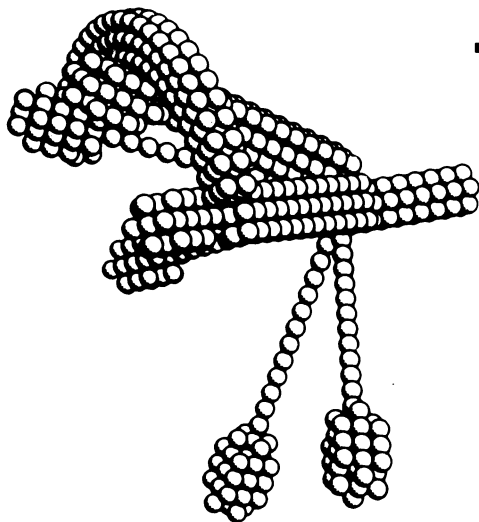

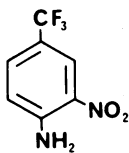

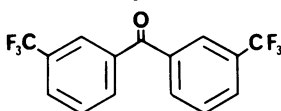

4-Amino-3-nitrobenzotrifluoride



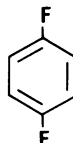

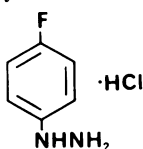

3-Fluoro-*p*-anisaldehyde



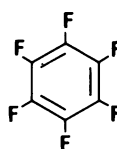

4-Fluorophenylhydrazine hydrochloride



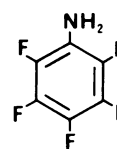

Hexafluorobenzene



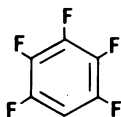

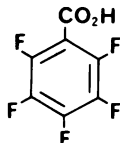

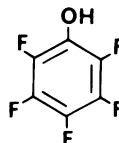

Pentafluorobenzoic acid



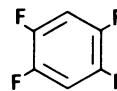

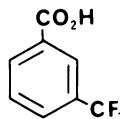

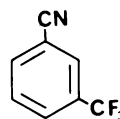

α,α,α -Trifluoro-*m*-toluic acid



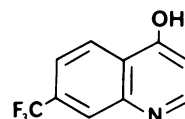
