Authors

The *Biochemical Journal* publishes papers in English in all fields of biochemistry, provided that they make a sufficient contribution to biochemical knowledge. Papers may include new results obtained experimentally, descriptions of new experimental methods of biochemical importance, or new interpretations of existing results. Theoretical contributions will be considered equally with papers dealing with experimental work. All work presented should have as its aim the development of biochemical concepts rather than the mere recording of facts. Preliminary, confirmatory or inconclusive work will not be published.

Papers are accepted from non-members and members of the Biochemical Society. Prospective authors should note that the *Biochemical Journal* offers rapid publication and makes no manuscript handling charges, no page charges and no charges for plates (except colour). Fifty reprints are provided free of charge; further copies are available at modest cost.

The paragraphs below are a summarized version of information provided in the Biochemical Society's *Policy of the Journal and Instructions to Authors* [*Biochem. J.* (1990) **265**, 1-21]. Copies are available free of charge from the Editorial Office.

The following types of submission are considered by the Editorial Board.

1. **Full-length Papers**
2. **Rapid Papers** (four printed pages maximum)
3. **Letters** (two printed pages maximum)
4. **Reviews** (usually solicited)

Full-length Papers and Rapid Papers

Full-length Papers may be of any length that is justified by their content. Authors should, however, note that because of pressure for space in the journal no paper, whatever its scientific merits, will be accepted if it exceeds the minimum length required for precision in describing the experiments and clarity in interpreting them. As a guide, most papers published in the journal are of between six and eight printed pages. A concise well-written paper tends to be published more rapidly.

Papers that can be accommodated in four pages of the journal will be treated as **Rapid Papers** if this is requested at the time of sub-

mission. They receive priority treatment and it is aimed for their publication to be within 3 months of receipt. However, the criteria of reviewing and the appearance of Rapid Papers in the journal are identical with those of Full-length Papers. In order to achieve the accelerated schedule, reviewers are asked to give priority to the paper and proofs of accepted Rapid Papers are not supplied to authors. In addition, Rapid Papers that do not contain half-tone figures may be submitted by FAX to the number below. In this case only one copy of the article is required, and acknowledgement of receipt and the review decision will be returned to the author by FAX. Refer to the current *Instructions to Authors* for details of this procedure. Rapid Papers must not exceed 4000 words, inclusive of title, synopsis and references; authors must also assess what proportion of a page will be occupied by insertions such as tables, figures and schemes and reduce the number of text words accordingly at the rate of 1200 words per full page of the journal.

Papers submitted for publication should be addressed to the Editorial Manager, The Biochemical Journal, 59 Portland Place, London W1N 3AJ, U.K. (telephone 071-637 5873; FAX 071-323 1136; from overseas the international code for the U.K. is +44 and the leading 0 should be omitted). Three copies of the typescript should be submitted. The typescript should bear the name, address and telephone number (and FAX number if possible) of the person to whom correspondence (including proofs) should be sent. An additional copy of the synopsis should be enclosed. The top copy should be accompanied by the original artwork; photocopies of line drawings are acceptable for the other two copies, but glossy prints (**not photocopies**) of all the halftone figures must be provided.

It is the journal's policy that fragmentation of reports of research should be avoided and that it will not publish material that has been wholly or largely published elsewhere, even as a preliminary communication or in unrefereed symposium proceedings. In order that the reviewers can assess these problems, authors should enclose copies (in duplicate) of relevant preceding published papers, especially if these did not appear in the *Biochemical Journal*. In addition, copies of the author's relevant work 'in press' or under editorial consideration in other journals should be included. Failure to do this may lead to delay in reviewing.

Before preparing papers, authors should consult a current issue of the journal to make

themselves familiar with the general format, such as the use of cross-headings, lay-out of tables and citation of references. Typescripts should be in double-spaced typing throughout (including the references and legends of tables and figures) on sheets of uniform size (preferably ISO A4) with wide margins. Output from computer printers must be of 'near letter' quality.

Either the Harvard system or the numerical system may be used for citation of references. A reference to 'unpublished work' should be accompanied by the names of all concerned; a reference to a 'personal communication' must be supported by written permission for the quotation from the person or persons concerned; both these types of citation are permitted in the text only, not in the list of references.

Authors should state under which section of the contents list they wish their paper to appear:

Proteins
Enzymes
Carbohydrates and lipids
Gene structure and expression
Regulation of metabolism
Membranes and bioenergetics
Receptors and signal transduction
Cell biology and development

BJ Letters and Reviews

BJ Letters are intended to provide an opportunity to discuss, criticize or expand particular points made in published work, or to present a new hypothesis. They should not be comments on general aspects of the biochemical world, nor should they be used as an alternative to a Rapid Paper. If a letter is polemical in nature a reply may be solicited from other interested parties before its publication. Letters must not exceed 1800 words, which is approximately the equivalent of two printed pages; one figure, table or scheme may be included. **BJ Letters** may also be submitted by FAX (see above).

Reviews will usually be solicited, although unsolicited reviews will be considered for publication; however, prospective writers of reviews should first consult the Reviews Editor, via the Editorial Office, and should enclose a short (one typed page) synopsis of the area they propose to cover.

The *Biochemical Journal* is published and distributed by Portland Press on behalf of the Biochemical Society. It is published twice monthly; in 1991 eight volumes (273-280) of three parts each will appear. An Annual Index is supplied to all subscribers as soon as possible after publication of the year's volumes, and the subscription also includes the annual compendium volume of *Biochemical Journal Reviews*.
